Teddy Hand Puppet



Adapted from Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child

You will need:

Double knitting yarn 4mm (Size 8) needles

Garter stitch throughout (every row is Knit)



Body

Cast on 18 stitches and work 40 rows in Knit (about 10cm / 4 inches)

Arms

Next row: cast on 10 stitches and knit to the end (28 stitches) **Next row:** cast on 10 stitches and knit to the end (38 stitches)

Continue in Knit for 8 more rows

Next row: Cast off 10 stitches and knit to end of row (28 stitches) **Next row:** Cast off 10 stitches and knit to end of row (18 stitches)

Head

Continue in Knit for 50 rows (about 12 ½ cm / 5 inches)

Arms

Next row: cast on 10 stitches and knit to the end (28 stitches) **Next row:** cast on 10 stitches and knit to the end (38 stitches)

Continue in Knit for 8 more rows

Next row: Cast off 10 stitches and knit to end of row (28 stitches) **Next row:** Cast off 10 stitches and knit to end of row (18 stitches)

Body

Knit 40 rows

Cast off, leaving about 45cm (18 inches) for sewing up

Make Up

Sew pieces together, leaving the bottom open

Face

Stitch 2 ears by 'pinching in' the two top corners Sew a diagonal line in running stitch, pull it tight to create the ear, repeat going back up the diagonal, then fasten off securely.

With contrasting yarn stitch a nose, smile and eyes.

It's worth taking time over this to ensure your teddy has a friendly, smiling face.

Scarf

I've used 4-pin French knitting (Knitting Nancy) for my bears. For stripes, thread two colours through the Knitting Nancy.

Cast on with one colour and work one round.

Now alternate the colours, working one round in each colour.

Continue until the scarf is long enough to tie in a knot.

Cast off with the colour used for the final round.

Alternatively, **Cast on** 4 stitches and work in Garter Stitch or Stocking Stitch (1 row Knit, 1 row Purl) until it is long enough, **Cast off**. A nice length of ribbon works well too.

Sew the scarf **securely** to the neck at the back of the puppet, tie at the front with a knot or a bow.
